I am filling in for the month of July in hopes that someone steps up to the plate and take over editorship of *The Brass Nuts*.




When old car clubs don't have good communication, they fall apart. I would hate to see our


parts. And, there were many early antique cars in the museum...even a few from the USA! I will let the pictures tell the story.

The speedster has a 22 horsepower, four cylinder engine which **Kevin** had to repair to working order. The speedster wheels are wood spoke. The car is blue.

Kevin used a professional style paint gun to paint the speedster a really nice blue color. He found a decal on the muffler which said "The Blue Streak" which he affixed to the hood and that's how his car got its name.

Kevin didn't take a long time to complete the car; he just started working on it last summer and all that needs doing to it now is to paint the hood.

He said the hardest thing to find for the car was a horn and **Patrick Hopkins** found one for him. And, the easiest things for him to find for the car was the stuff in his Dad's garage!

The work he liked doing least on the car was varnishing the woodwork because he said that was a lot of work.

The best part of restoring the car was getting to start it up. And the not so good part about that is he is not old enough to drive it! He says he gets to move it around on the property; however, his Dad drives it a lot.

Kevin's next project is a 1961 Ford pick-up.

I'm sure his parents, **Robin and Cindy Pharis** and sister, **Sarah** are very proud of this young man's accomplishment to complete such a car in such short order!



Technical Tip

As Shared by Bob Hopkins, Jr.

Bob shares with us that we should all carry working fire extinguishers in our old cars.
