Early in the preceding week rain was forecast for Sunday, March 27, 2022 – but it did not materialize until after dark that evening and, fortunately, we enjoyed comfortable weather for our annual event. By departure time at 10:30 I counted 29 antique cars in the Cameron Park Safeway parking lot - with members of NorCal, Bay Area and El Dorado Horseless Carriage Clubs, Sacramento and Mother Lode Model T Ford Clubs and the Hangtown A's represented. A few modern cars joined us as well, with approximately 70 people participating in the tour.

The 42 mile ride through the very scenic back roads of El Dorado County took about 2 hours and concluded with a barbecue and ice cream social at our Shingle Springs home. Antique cars parked in the Orchard and Vineyard and upon arrival guests were treated to Sangria served in a brass colored punch bowl given to the NorCal HCCA Chapter by Bill Harrah in 1977. It looked like it has only been used a few times in the last 45 years.

Some guests enjoyed looking at the progress made on restoring a '26 TT "C" Cab Flatbed Truck that I recently acquired - which will eventually become running yard art on our property. Others enjoyed a guided tour of Patricia's fine art collection. After lunch people had the opportunity to build their own ice cream treat choosing from a variety of toppings and shortly thereafter those who desired visited our back-yard winery for a barrel tasting and sample of several wines we make.

Patricia and I look forward to hosting the event again next year and hope you can attend.









The Kissel's Award Winning 1929 Kissel on Display at the Grand Classic Car Show

Jeanne and I exhibited *Miss Amy*, our 1929 Kissel White Eagle 8-95 Tourster (car# 1504), at the *Grand Classic Car Show* sponsored by the San Diego/Palm Springs Regions of the Classic Car Club of America (CCCA). The show was held on the elegant lawns of the Inn at Rancho Santa Fe on March 19, 2022.

It was a lovely spring day in Southern California, and a perfect car show day. The town of Rancho Santa Fe (near the Pacific Ocean between Los Angeles and San Diego) has a Mediterranean climate, and our cool overcast morning quickly warmed to a pleasant sunny afternoon. The architecture of Inn and most of the downtown is California mission style; quite fetching.

Every Saturday, the town hosts an informal car show of its own on the downtown streets adjacent to the Inn (think Porsche, Maserati, Audi, BMW). Many people took in both the town and the CCCA show this day.

The CCCA designates only select 1915-1948 cars as "fine" or "distinctive" automobiles and as Full Classics(tm). Many Kissel automobiles are Full Classics(tm), including Miss Amy.



CCCA uses a 100-point judging system with the entrant car evaluated against a "car as it would have been when delivered new."

We are delighted and honored to report that Miss Amy received a *CCCA First Prize* (95 points and above) in the Primary Division with a judged score of 97-1/2. The CCCA will be issuing a small, numbered oval badge, which must be affixed to the car if it is exhibited at future Grand Classics. Always the modest one and not yet in possession of Miss Amy's metal oval, I'm already thinking of places to mount the badge on the car!

The hard part of the event was the 1000+mile round trip towing Miss Amy inside our 20' enclosed trailer. Coupled with our Excursion, this makes for a considerable chunk of rolling stock. I was concerned about the 10-hour one-way drive, especially the traverse of Los Angeles on Interstate 5. I was pleased to find that my fellow motorists were polite and courteous and we made the journey without undo adventure or threat of peril.

Another hard part was the two years of effort that we have invested in the car since her 2019 acquisition. Significant starting, electrical, carburetion, fuel, cooling issues have been addressed. Damaged top irons were repaired and friend Joe (Anino's Upholstery) made a beautiful, new fabric top and covers for the car. (Joe's red trim on the covers for the car are a masterful stroke that, for me, really makes the car "pop".) The mechanicals on the car have been refreshed and the car is running great.

The last month has been devoted to authenticity issues and a deep cleaning. In the sprucing of Miss Amy's cosmetics, more than one day, each, was devoted to the cleaning of her six wire wheels (think



little sponge swabs while wearing a personal headlight); a "swirl removing" wax considerably cleaned and brightened her paint; metal polish and elbow grease were applied to all her bright work. A new stainless-steel radiator cap was fashioned; it was cut on a lathe from billet SS 303 then sanded to 10,000 grit then polished on a buffing wheel. Aside from the slight "grey" tint of polished stainless compared with "blue" chrome, I doubt anyone will notice or question the authenticity of this new cap.

Miss Amy will not be resting on her laurels. Coming right up within a week is the annual Pava Multi-Car-Club Tour, Barbecue and Ice Cream Social. In June, Miss Amy is scheduled for a five-day Nickel Era Tour in Moscow, Idaho. Still more shows and tours are contemplated for this year. Miss Amy received special invitations to two concours from organizers after seeing her at Rancho Santa Fe. These will be great opportunities to tell the Kissel story.

It would be an understatement to say I was pleased with our performance at this show.
