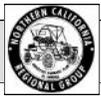

On Sunday, May 22, Jan and I joined other NCRG members gathered at Matt and Maya Ryan's home in preparation for their Art Studio Tour. Other participants were Jim and Kathy Ryan and Clay, Michaelynn and Fiona Ryan. The cars going on the tour were Matt and Maya's 1913 Ford Model T touring and 1915 Ford Model T speedster and Jim and Kathy's 1931 Ford Model A sedan. Shortly after noon, we departed for an eleven-mile drive to Judy Arrigotti's Art Studio in El Dorado Hills. Our tour route took us on Folsom-Auburn Road to Folsom Lake Crossing, East Natoma Street, Green Valley Road, and Salmon Falls Road to Lakehills Drive – all beautiful back-country roads in rolling hills. On the Crossing, we had a good view of Folsom Lake, and it was reassuring to see that it is about 90% full during this drought year.

Judy Arrigotti is a former teacher who taught both Clay and Matt in combined 4th and 5th grade classes. Some NCRG members may recall a tour in the past to Judy and her husband Steve's home to see their large outdoor garden railroad. Jan and I know Judy and Steve through the garden railroading hobby. Judy has been teaching art to children and adults for over thirty years. When she retired from school teaching to pursue her art full time, they built the studio and gallery. Her artwork includes carved and painted gourds, clay sculptures and oil and acrylic paintings on canvas. She often incorporates contributions of Native American, African, Asian and other cultures in her gourds.

Their art studio was one of 15, representing 43 artists, that were participating in the El Dorado Hills Art Association's "Art Studio Tour 2022" on the weekend that we visited. One of the Arrigotti relatives had a selection of her jewelry on display and Steve had his pens turned from various rare woods available. While we were there, Mr.



& Mrs. Zittel stopped in for a tour. Zittel Farms (the last working farm in Folsom) has provided most of the gourds for Judy's long standing carved and painted gourd art. Most of us have seen their stand at

Auburn-Folsom Road and Oak Avenue just north of Greenback. In addition to catching up with long-time friends, meeting new folks and viewing the many and varied pieces on display, the Arrigottis offered snacks and drinks from their studio with its impressive view of the hills.




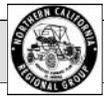

- **1906 San Francisco Video** – Want to ride down the street in San Francisco, in 1906? There is a YouTube video sent by member Riley Best, and on the HCCA Website. “New Version of footage San Francisco 1906, A Trip Down Market Street, Shot on April 14, 1906, four days before the San Francisco earthquake and fire. From the front of a cable car, a motion picture camera records a trip down Market Street, San Francisco, California, from a point between 8th & 9th Streets, Eastward to the cable car turnaround at the Ferry Building.” Check it out: <https://youtu.be/sHkc83XA2dY>

- **T Time at The Gilmore** – From Hemmings Motor News; “The Gilmore Car Museum invites car enthusiasts to take part in its Model T Driving Experience program. Learn all about driving and operating an authentic Model T from the museum’s fleet of cars.

The classes last around three hours and allow you to drive along 3 miles of paved roads at Gilmore’s large campus. The sessions are taught by long-time Model T owners and enthusiasts. Plus, participants learn backstories about the early Ford Motor Company and take part in inspections of various Ts during the special guided tours. Openings are still available as early as June, all the way through September.

Each class is \$125 per student and is open to anyone with a driver’s license or valid learner’s permit. After the class, participants are presented with a Certificate of Completion and a souvenir booklet. Visit gilmorecarmuseum.org to reserve a spot.



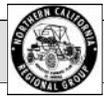
SOUVENIRS FROM THE PAST
